1. 2024 figures are shown in brackets.
2. Maximum possible score is 75 (82). Occasions where ringing is by invitation are not included.
3. Total attendance by ringers was 1256 (1405). This figure includes 24 attendances by identified ringers who are not shown and who rang once only in 2025. There were no unidentified visitors in 2025 (30 in 2024). The average attendance was 16.7 (17.1).
4. The longest uninterrupted run *in 2025* was 56 consecutive attendances achieved by FHK. Philip Hensman finally bowed out after morning ringing on 14 September 2025, concluding 1105 consecutive attendances. This run started with morning ringing on 20 June 2010. Until 14 September, Philip had missed only two Sunday service ringing occasions on the new bells (first rung for a service on 26 July 2009).
5. Each asterisk by a name indicates that an attendance has been counted although the ringer did not actually ring.
